

Band Camp

1. The role of all chaperone volunteers is to assist with all aspects of band camp as determined by the Band Director and Head Chaperone.
2. Chaperones are required to have completed all volunteer forms with the boosters and school, and also have their license scanned in the front office.
3. When chaperoning, please try to wear a WKHS band shirt whenever possible. Also, chaperone badges and lanyards are to be worn.
4. All chaperones must comply with White Knoll High School, Lexington District 1, and WKHS Band rules and policies. In particular, it is prohibited to use alcohol, tobacco, or inappropriate language on campus and in front of students. If a chaperone is found breaking any of these rules, they will be asked to leave campus, and be prohibited from being a chaperone in any future event.
5. Chaperones should exhibit appropriate behavior in front of the students at all times. Set the example and be the role model for the kids. When you chaperone, you are every student's parent!
6. Any non-band children, friends or guests of a chaperone will not be the responsibility of the WKHS Band program. White Knoll High School, and Lexington District 1 will not be liable for any incidents resulting in injury, theft, or other damage.
7. Any questions regarding duties, times, and responsibilities will be determined by the head chaperone. The Band Directors are very busy during band camp; please seek council from the head chaperones before approaching the directors.
8. Please be respectful to the band directors, and all other adults. Never countermand the authority of the band directors. If you disagree with them, schedule an appropriate time to discuss in private. Never show any dissent in front of other students or parents.
9. Chaperone duties include but are not limited to the following:
 - Be on site during rehearsals
 - Parents, including chaperones, are not allowed on the field unless they are delivering coolers, props, or helping a sick child. Rehearsals are closed. Parents and other guests may observe rehearsals from the top of the stairs. If we are in the stadium, they are welcome to sit in the stands.
 - Assist with any health issues any student or adult might have
 - Fill water coolers in the morning with ice and appropriate liquid, and also refill as needed
 - Supervision of students during breaks, meals, in the hallways, restrooms, etc.
 - Help maintain cleanliness of school facility, including halls, rooms, and outside of building
10. If a student becomes ill, the chaperone will stay with that student in case medical attention is needed. The chaperone will have all medical forms on file, and if needed, will contact the parent of a sick child if determined by the band director or head chaperone.
11. When dealing with the students, please "ask" the student(s) to comply with your request. Please do not yell or make unreasonable demands. Treat each child as if they were your own. If a student does not comply, bring it to the attention of the head chaperone or band director.
