

MEET THE JUDGES _

Music Performance - Field **RICK MURPHY**

Tupelo, Mississippi

With 41 years teaching experience, Rick Murphy retired in June 2021 from Tupelo (Mississippi) High School, where he was director of bands. Previously to teaching in Mississippi, Murphy taught (and also retired) in Tennessee (31 years), both at the high school and collegiate level (McGavock, Columbia Central and Middle Tennessee State University). His concert and marching bands have appeared in national and international venues, among them national finalists at Music For All Grand National Championships three times, Tennessee State Champions five times, Presidential Inaugural Parades, and a plethora of wind band music convention concert performances.

Music Performance DAVE MACKINNON Kitchener, Ontario, Canada

Dave MacKinnon has been active as a brass teacher, arranger and clinician in Canada since 1977. He was the Music Director for the Ventures All-Girl Drum Corps from 1978 to 1993. During his seventeen year tenure with the Ventures the drum corps received international recognition in the world of marching music finishing thirteen years in the top three of their competitive class including five first place awards at the Drum Corps International Class A and All-Girl championships.

Since 1994 Dave has been a brass instructor and brass Caption Head with the Bluecoats Drum Corps from Canton, Ohio He presently holds the position of Brass Consultant with the Bluecoats.

He has hosted various brass clinics in Japan, Korea and the United States over the last twenty-nine years and has been a sought after music adjudicator at numerous state high school marching band championships in New York, Michigan, Indiana, Kentucky, South Carolina, Mississippi and Nebraska.

Music Effect JOEL DENTON

Chattanooga, Tennessee

Mr. Denton is a graduate of the University of Tennessee and has completed graduate studies at UT-Chattanooga. Mr. Denton currently serves as an Adjunct Professor of Instrumental Music Education and Conductor of the Wind Ensemble at Lee University.

Prior to his retirement in 2018, he was recognized as a CMA Music Teacher of Excellence. At the 2015 Midwest Clinic, Mr. Denton was awarded the John Phillip Sousa Foundation Legion of Honor for his contributions to band. Under his direction, the Ooltewah Band achieved a national reputation for musical excellence including performances in the 2017 Tournament of Roses Parade, the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in 2013 and 2007, and as the only band in the 2011 Disney Christmas Parade on ABC. The Ooltewah Marching Band was a consistent finalist at Bands of America Regional Championships being awarded multiple class championships and placements, and was a national semi-finalist on multiple occasions with several class placements. The Ooltewah Concert Bands performed at the Music for All Southeast Regional Concert Festival in 2016, the TMEA (TN) State Music

Conference in 2014 and 2010, the Smoky Mountain Music Festival in 2011(Grand Concert Division Champions), and multiple other state, regional and national events through the years.

He served as Chairman of Fine Arts at Ooltewah from 1982 until his retirement and was selected five times as the Ooltewah Teacher of the Year. The Tennessee Governor's School for the Arts has thrice honored him. His professional affiliations include National Association for Music Education. Tennessee Music Education Association, East Tennessee School Band and Orchestra Association, Phi Beta Mu. National Band Association. American School Band Director Association, and Tennessee Bandmasters Association.

Mr. Denton currently serves as the Tennessee State Chair for the National Band Association and is a Past President of the East Tennessee Band and Orchestra Association and the Tennessee Bandmasters Association. He has served as the State Legislative Delegate and Advocacy Chair for Tennessee Music Education Association and served as a member of the Tennessee Department of Education's Fine Arts Student Growth Committee. He is active as an adjudicator, clinician, and consultant working with Music for All/Bands of America, Drum Corps International, several universities and state organizations, as well as, many high school bands across the nation. Through his corporation Leading the Way, Inc., Mr. Denton presents professional development sessions across the nation and also works with band programs and other organizations on developing leadership and teambuilding skills.

ANDY COMBITESBrighton, Minnesota

Andy Combites is an active designer, instructor, and adjudicator for marching bands, drum corps, and color guards. For his "real" job, he works as a Digital Marketing Manager in the Health Care Business Group at 3M, where he spends his day working on Social Media programs and websites (so yes, he technically gets paid to surf Facebook and YouTube and play with an iPad at work!).

He and his family live in New Brighton, Minnesota - a northern suburb of Minneapolis and St. Paul. He also judged a chili cookoff at work one time, which was the most delicious yet painful judging experience of his life.

San Antonio, Texas

Mark Moreno has more than 20 years of experience in the marching arts activity. From color guard to drill design, Moreno's overall involvement has earned numerous Bands of America Regional Championships and Grand National Finals appearances. Additionally, he has designed for Oregon Crusades and Phantom Regiment drum corps.

Mark performed as a member of Fantasia Winter Guard and the Blue Devils Drum and Bugle Corps. He is a full time visual designer for marching band and winter guards across the country as well as an adjudicator and clinician.

Visual Effect TODD JAMES Oklahoma City, Oklahoma

2023 finds Todd thrilled to be joining the BOA active roster with the opportunity to celebrate and reward visual performances across the US!

He is the former Program Coordinator, Visual Designer, and Colorguard Director at Winston Churchill High School in San Antonio, Texas.

In the world of field pageantry, he was responsible for choreographing and staging 20+ San Antonio Schools in the annual Battle of the Band/Battle of Flowers Band Festival. He staged and produced the Alamodome Grand Opening Celebration, and was responsible for bringing together over 4,000 vocal students and colorguards for the Northeast Fall Festival. He has also served as a guest speaker for Texas Bandmasters Association.

Additionally he served as the Director of Musical Theater at South

Texas' premiere Fine Arts High School Northeast School of the Arts (NESA) in San Antonio, Texas.

Under his direction, his musical theater productions were selected for both Texas and National Thespian Convention performances, as well as the Fringe Festival.

2023 finds him visually designing, consulting, and serving as guest clinician for various programs throughout the country, specializing in achievable Design and Effect for smaller programs.

His performance background includes various summer stock, regional, and national productions as well as a cast member of two international tours. He has appeared on numerous cruise ships and serves as the emcee of America's Youth on Parade. Reality television fans may know him from Toddlers and Tiaras!

When not inspiring those in the arts, he is the owner of Thompson's Creations in Oklahoma City, a specialty fabric showroom providing winning looks and designs for a multitude of groups and individuals throughout performance genres.


